

Camp FAQ's

We wanted to touch base to help answer any questions that you may have before attending one of camps, so we put together a list of the FAQ's below to help out.

Frequently Asked Questions About Attending Softball Magazine's Camps

What to bring equipment wise? - We always suggest that you bring everything you would normally take to play league or tournament ball at home. Your playing shoes, fielding glove, batting gloves and any other personal braces or wraps. You can bring your bat bag or backpack to the fields.

Should I bring my own bat? - You can bring your own bats but most Do Not. There will be close to 120 demo bats from multiple vendors in assorted weights and models all lined up for you to use in all activities during camp. You get to try the newest releases before most of the nation has even seen these bats. It's a great way to try many different model bats without having to buy them first. One last thought on bringing your bats, you can use them in batting practice only, we require that the demo bats be used in all of our camp activities such as scrimmage games and contests.

Attire & Dress for Camps? - It's Florida! I think we call it Florida casual?

At the fields we suggest you dress as you normally would to play softball games at home in league or tournament play. The temps should average in the high 70's during the day and in the low 60's at night. So dress and pack accordingly.

Release & Rooming List Form? - We will be sending through email a release form along with a hotel rooming form in a pdf to your email. We do this as convenience to those who like to have everything completed before getting to the fields

If you do not want to do anything ahead of time and it's your vacation, then no worries we will have forms and pens available on-site for you to complete the forms at the Wednesday evening meet & greet and at the fields Thursday morning.

Family & Friends at the park? - Yes! Your family and friends are welcome to come to fields and watch, hang out and enjoy the weather. Please remember that the catered lunches are for the camp players only.

Vendors at the event? - Yes all of the supporting vendors will have booths setup along with other apparel, shoe and softball equipment companies that are open for business. So if you blew out those batting gloves or those old turf shoes have seen better days, you will be able to purchase gear on-site.
